

PHARMACY PGY-1 RESIDENCY
Offered by Integris Baptist Medical Center
Department of Pharmacy

The purpose of the residency is to develop the knowledge and skills needed to enable the pharmacist to proficiently provide pharmaceutical care and to make meaningful contributions to the pharmacy profession.

At the completion of the residency, the resident should demonstrate the following:

- Marketable skills
- The ability to work effectively on a team
- Proficiency in providing pharmaceutical care
- A positive professional attitude and leadership skills
- A commitment to continuous self-learning
- Effective communication and teaching

The resident will provide staffing and pharmaceutical care support for Integris Health, but the institution supports the ideal that the residency fulfill the resident's professional goals by providing opportunity to master fundamental skills as well as experience a broad range of practice settings.

OBJECTIVES

The outcomes of the residency are achieved through the activities of the practicums using a subset of goals with accompanying objectives as defined by ASHP as Educational Outcomes for Pharmacy (PGY-1) Residencies. The resident is expected to demonstrate proficiency in the areas of medication use, medication therapy management, leadership and practice management, project management, education and training, and utilization of informatics by the completion of the residency.

PHARMACY PGY-1 RESIDENCY

- ❖ All applicants must be graduates of an accredited pharmacy program in the United States and must be eligible for licensure in the state of Oklahoma within 2 months of beginning the residency.
- ❖ Primary goal is to prepare the resident for a career in pharmacy practice or for specialized residency or fellowship training.
- ❖ The residency is one year in duration.
- ❖ The residency structure can be tailored within broad guidelines and objectives to fit the individual needs of the applicant to focus on tertiary areas of interest in certain circumstances.
- ❖ The resident will support pharmacy services via staffing according to the expectations for full-time staff, subject to change based on needs of the pharmacy. Additional options for staffing are also available.
- ❖ The resident will be required to complete an original project, and present that project at an appropriate forum.
- ❖ Teaching opportunities for students in the professional pharmacy curriculum are available.

STIPEND/BENEFITS

- ❖ Required residency hours will provide annual stipend of approximately \$41,000.
- ❖ Vacation and holiday time accrued each pay period.
- ❖ Eligible for full benefit package including health and dental insurance coverage.
- ❖ Flexible scheduling provided for interviewing needs and experiential opportunities.

FACILITIES & PRACTICE SITES

Integris Baptist Medical Center:

- ❖ 511 bed state-of-the-art facility
- ❖ Provides comprehensive care to the metro Oklahoma City community and to specialized patient populations from the state of Oklahoma and broader regions.
- ❖ Practice areas within the facility include general, emergency, and transplant medicine, pediatrics, infectious diseases, surgery, oncology, neonatology, burns, primary care anticoagulation and transplant clinic. Additional opportunities exist in hyperglycemia management (within facility) and cardiology (outside facility).

Core Practicums:

These practicums are required, and are arranged in blocks of 2 to 5 weeks, except for Ambulatory Care, Pharmacy Practice Management and Free Clinic which are longitudinal for the duration of the residency. Additional focus (core extensions) can be chosen in certain core areas.

Selectives:

The resident may choose up to 13 weeks of additional practicum experiences from the selectives (range 1 - 4 weeks per selective chosen).

- ❖ Your formal application should be made through the PhORCAS portal and should include:
 - Current vita
 - 3 letters of recommendation using the standard form through PhORCAS
 - *An additional, optional recommendation may be submitted from an individual with a specialty outside pharmacy practice (e.g. non-pharmacy employer/supervisor, teacher)*
 - Transcripts from baccalaureate and/or Pharm.D. training
- ❖ Application deadline is **January 20, 2017****
- ❖ On-site interview dates: 1/26/17, 2/2/17, 2/7/17, 2/16/17, 2/21/17
- ❖ Final match rankings due on national website **March 3, 2017**; results available March 17th.
